



# Information about Cumbria County Council's Telecare service



#### **About the service**

Cumbria County Council offers a Telecare service to support people to live independently in their own home. Telecare is based around a pendant worn around the neck or wrist. This provides access to a 24-hour monitoring service offering an instant response at the touch of a button from anywhere in your home or garden. The service is provided on behalf of Cumbria by Welbeing who provide Telecare services across the UK.

Telecare can be linked to a series of alarms or sensors in key parts of your home offering an immediate early warning if something is wrong e.g. smoke detector.

# What is Telecare?

Telecare is for vulnerable people living at home, especially those who:

- would find peace of mind from being able to summon help in an emergency;
- have dementia or memory loss;
- are at risk of falling;
- may be regularly admitted to hospital;
- •need help managing risks in the home e.g. smoke, fire, flood, natural gas, carbon monoxide.
- have a sensory impairment; or
- have learning disabilities.

#### How does it work?

The equipment is installed simply and quickly into your home. All that is needed is a telephone line and a nearby electric socket. When you feel at risk, vulnerable or simply need reassurance – you can connect with the contact centre at just the press of a button. You then speak to trained staff, if they cannot get in touch they will summon help. Help can be from keyholders, friends, family, care agencies or the emergency services.

### How to get the service

If you already have a social worker or occupational therapist, please ask them about Telecare. If you do not have a social worker, please contact your local Cumbria Adult Social Care office.

We may be able to arrange Telecare for you in one of two ways:

1 You can get Telecare as a **preventative service** - help you remain as independent as possible long term and to try to prevent you needing more support in the future. The cost is £5.95 per month.

2 You can get Telecare as part of a package of ongoing support arranged following an assessment of your needs. The cost is £1.75 per week included as part of your **personal budget** (subject to financial assessment).

Cumbria County Council does not charge its customers for Telecare equipment or installation, the above costs are for monitoring and maintenance of equipment.

Welbeing is a provider of high quality alarm monitoring services based in the UK, with a state of the art industry Platinum accredited Telecare response centre.
