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## Barrow-in-Furness District – Key Points

### Population

- Smaller proportion of residents aged 0-29 years in 2017 (33.6%) than in the North West (37.0%) and England (36.9%).
- Larger proportion of residents aged 75+ years in 2017 (9.3%) than in the North West and England (both 8.2%).

### Ethnicity

- Larger proportion of White residents in 2011 (98.3%) than in the North West (90.2%) and England (85.4%).
- Smaller proportion of households where English is not the main language in 2011 (0.7%) than in the North West (2.9%) and England (4.4%).

### Disability

- Proportion of residents with day-to-day activities limited a lot in 2011 (13.0%) is larger than in England (8.3%) and the North West (10.3%); Barrow-in-Furness has the highest proportion of all the districts.
- Barrow-in-Furness had the highest rate of concessionary travel cards issued because of disability at September 2018 (15.0 per 1,000) than all the districts, higher than the NoWCard area (14.9 per 1,000).

### Religion

- Larger proportion of residents identifying as Christian in 2011 (70.7%) than the North West (67.3%) and England (59.4%).
- Larger proportion of residents with no religious beliefs in 2011 (22.1%) than the North West (19.8%), although smaller than England (24.7%).

### Children and Young People

- Prevalence of overweight (including obesity) in Reception age children (age 4-5 years) in 2017-18 (31.2%) are statistically worse than England (22.4%); Barrow-in-Furness has the highest proportion of all the districts.
- Barrow-in-Furness has the highest obesity (including severe obesity) levels in Reception age children (age 4-5 years) for boys in 2013-14 to 2017-18 (14.4%) of all the districts; obesity levels for girls (13.7%) are also higher than all the other districts.
- Nationally, levels of childhood obesity are greater in areas where there are higher levels of deprivation. In Barrow-in-Furness 15.9% of Reception age children classified as obese (including severely obese) in 2013-14 to 2017-18 are living in the most deprived quintile in England, the highest proportion of all the districts.
- The most frequently represented ethnic groups represented in Barrow-in-Furness's schools in the January 2018 School Census are: Any Other White Background; Any Other Mixed Background; White & Asian. These three ethnic groups appear in the top six in each district.
- There are a total of 73 different languages spoken in schools in Cumbria in the January 2018 School Census. In Barrow-in-Furness 2.3% of pupils do not have English as their first language. Polish and 'Other' languages account for 74.4% of EAL pupils.
- Over two thirds (43%) of the SEND pupils in schools in Barrow-in-Furness in January 2018 are categorised as 'no specific SEND type (21.1%)' and 'speech, language & communication' (22.0%). These proportions are much larger than the Cumbria proportions for these two categories.
- 31.0% of pupils with 'no specialist SEN type' are in schools in Barrow in January 2018 (308 of 992 pupils).

## Adults

- Largest proportion of White British adult education students of all the districts in 2017-18 (93.7%; 754).
- Second largest proportion of adult education students in 2017-18 aged 16-29 (24.0%; 193).
- There are larger proportions of female adult education students in 2017-18 in all Cumbria's districts. In Barrow-in-Furness, female students made up 70.3% of the total (566), 2.4 times more than male students; this is the second largest proportion of all Cumbria's districts.
- Proportion of female adult social care service users in the Furness Health & Social Care (HSC) district in March 2019 1.5 times more than male service users (60.3%; 1,189); this is largest proportion of all Cumbria's HSC districts.
- Second largest proportion of adult social care service users in the Furness HSC district in March 2019 aged 18-64 years of all Cumbria's HSC districts (36.1%; 712).
- Second largest number of known BME adult social care service users in March 2019 (14; 0.7%) of all Cumbria's HSC districts.

## Health

- Life expectancy at birth (male) 2015-17 (77.2 years) is worse than England (79.6 years); Barrow-in-Furness has the lowest male life expectancy at birth of all Cumbria's districts.
- Life expectancy at birth (female) 2015-17 (81.1 years) is statistically worse than England (83.1 years); Barrow-in-Furness has the lowest female life expectancy at birth of all Cumbria's districts.
- Over two fifths of men in Barrow-in-Furness in 2018 (43.8%) are estimated to consume more than 4 units of alcohol per day, greater than the UK estimated average (41.3%), and the largest proportion of all Cumbria's districts.
- Around one third of women in Barrow-in-Furness (30.6%) are estimated to consume more than 3 units of alcohol per day in 2018, greater than the UK estimated average (28.9%), and the largest proportion of all Cumbria's districts.
- Smoking in pregnancy: the proportion of women smoking at the time of delivery in 2017-18 (13.9%; 89) is statistically worse than England (10.8%); Barrow-in-Furness has the highest proportion, along with South Lakeland.

## Housing

- The proportion of single person households aged 65+ in 2011 (14.5%) is larger than the national (England) proportion (12.4%).

## Economic activity and employment

- The proportion of males aged 16-64 out of work and claiming benefits at November 2018 (3.9%) is higher than the Great Britain proportion (3.1%) and higher than the proportion of females in Barrow-in-Furness out of work and claiming benefits (2.6%).
- The proportion of males aged 16-64 years in 2017-18 who are economically inactive (19.2%) is greater than the national (England) proportion (16.3%), and the largest proportion of all Cumbria's districts.
- The proportion of females aged 16-64 years in 2017-18 who are economically inactive (29.3%) is greater than the national (England) proportion (26.3%), and the largest proportion of all Cumbria's districts.

## Hate Crime

- Barrow-in-Furness had a total of 361 recorded hate strands flagged on recorded incidents between January 2014 and November 2018.

- The most common hate strand flagged was racial hate, followed by sexual orientation, then disability, then religious and finally transphobic.

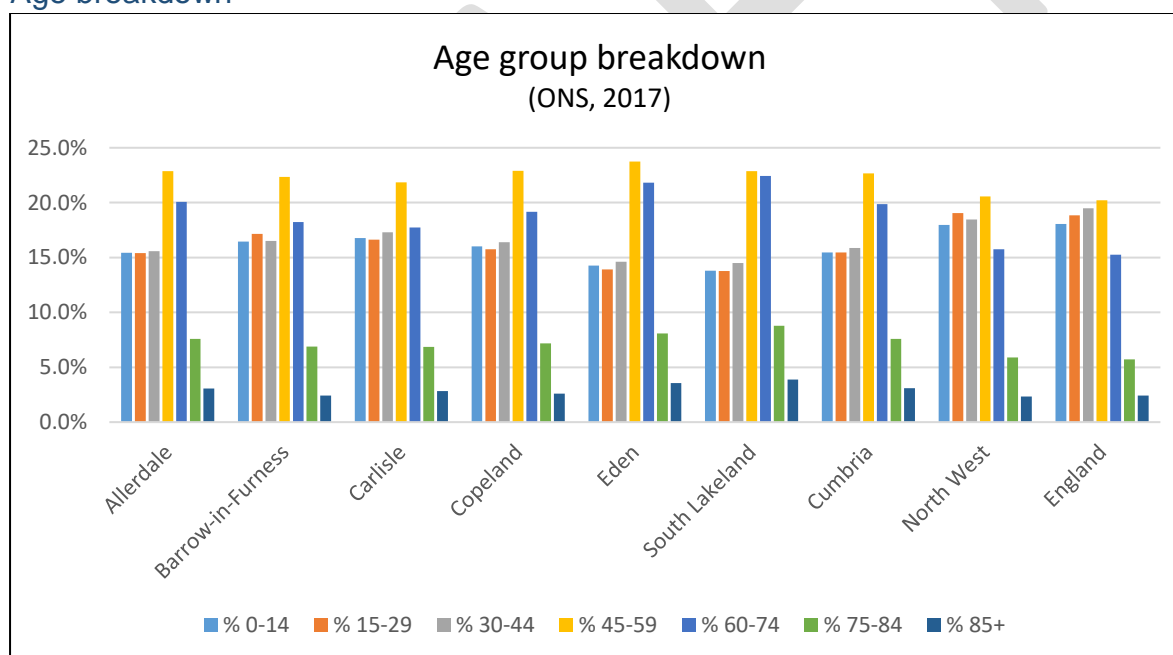

### Age breakdown



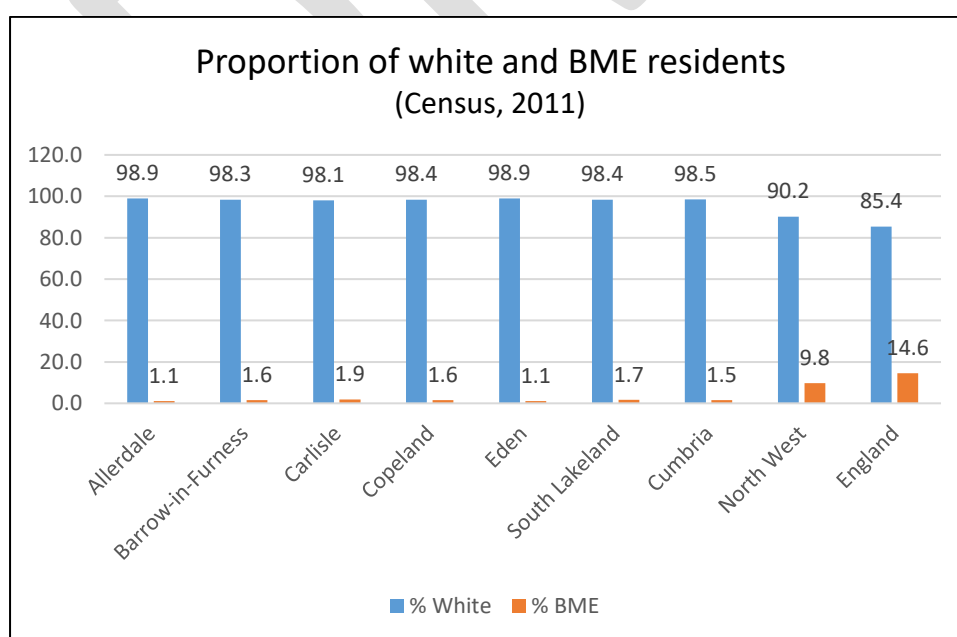

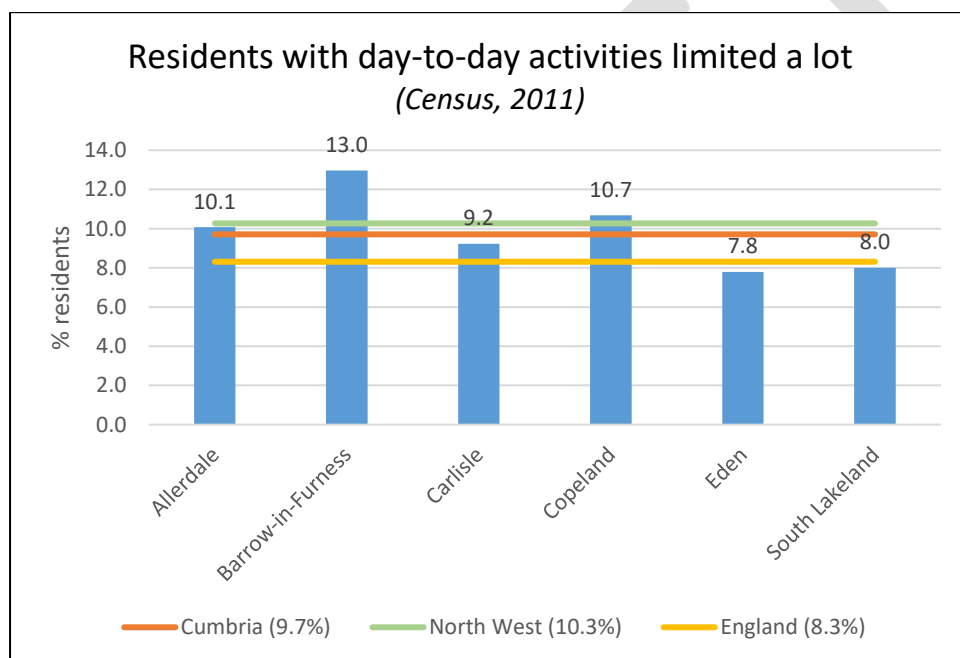

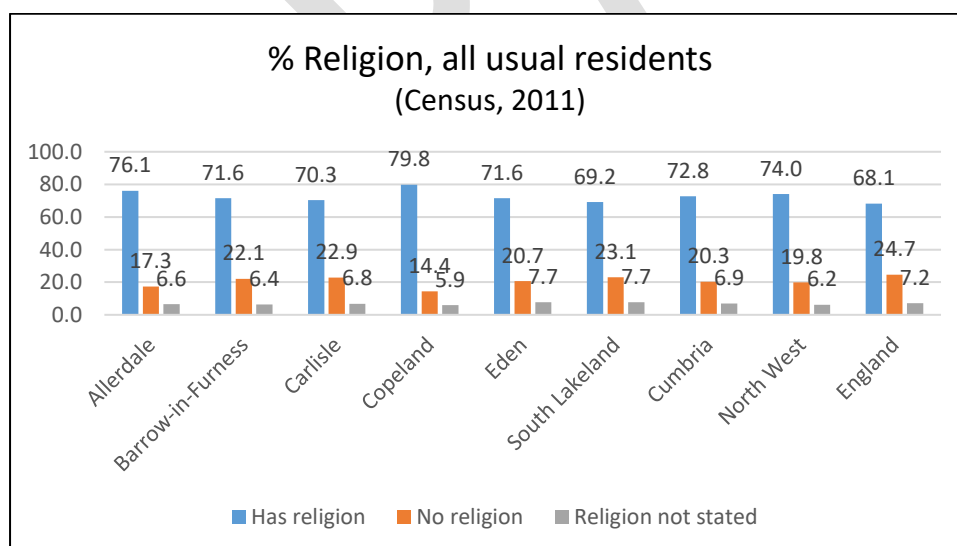

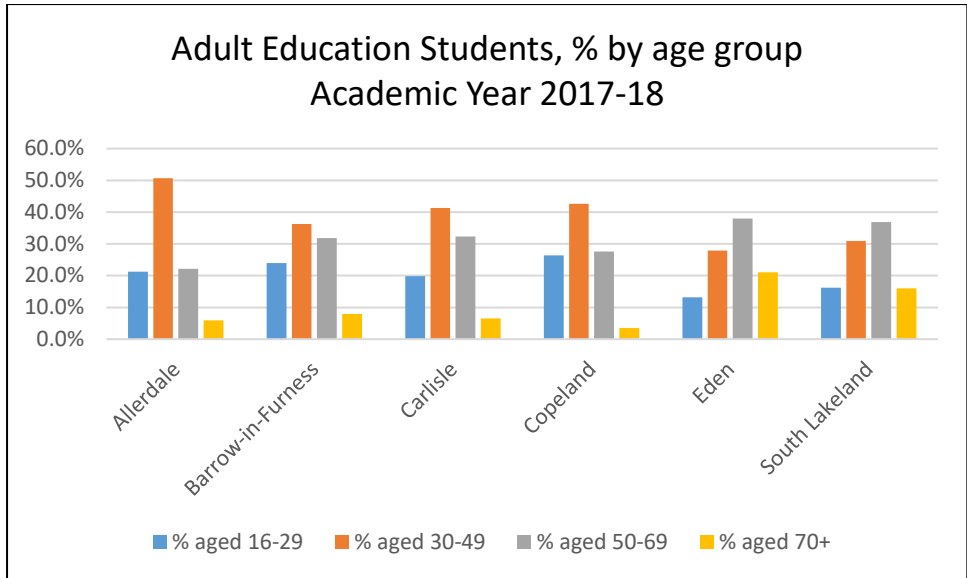

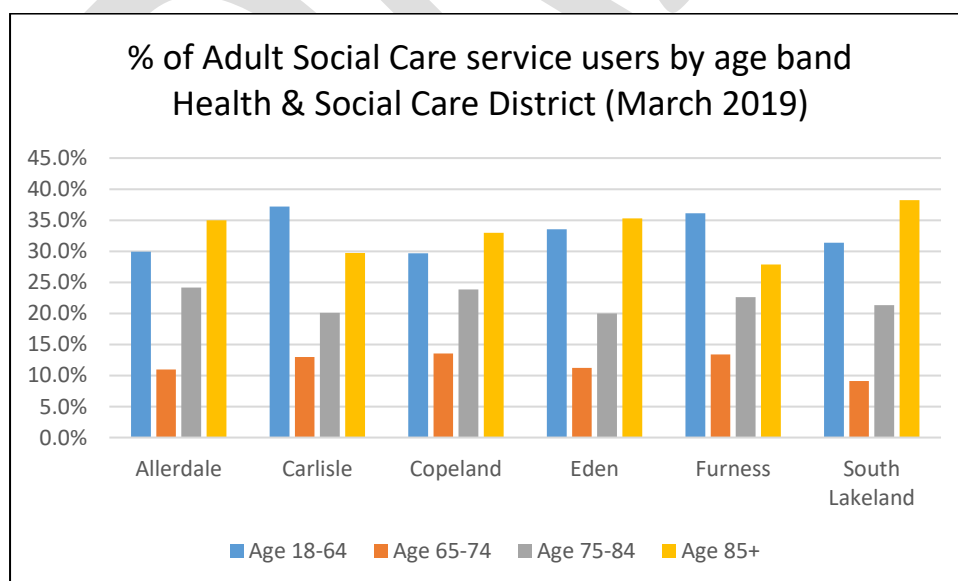

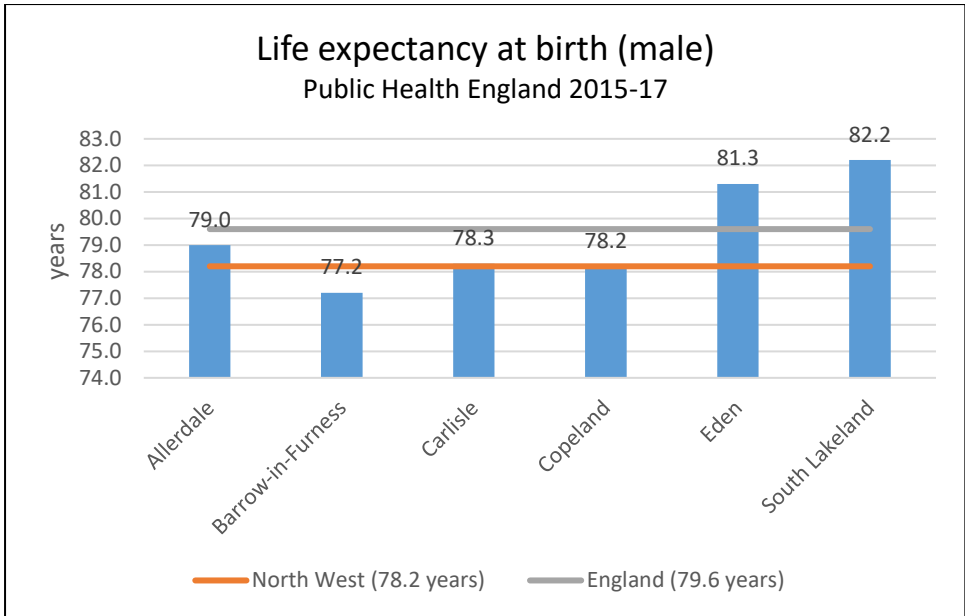

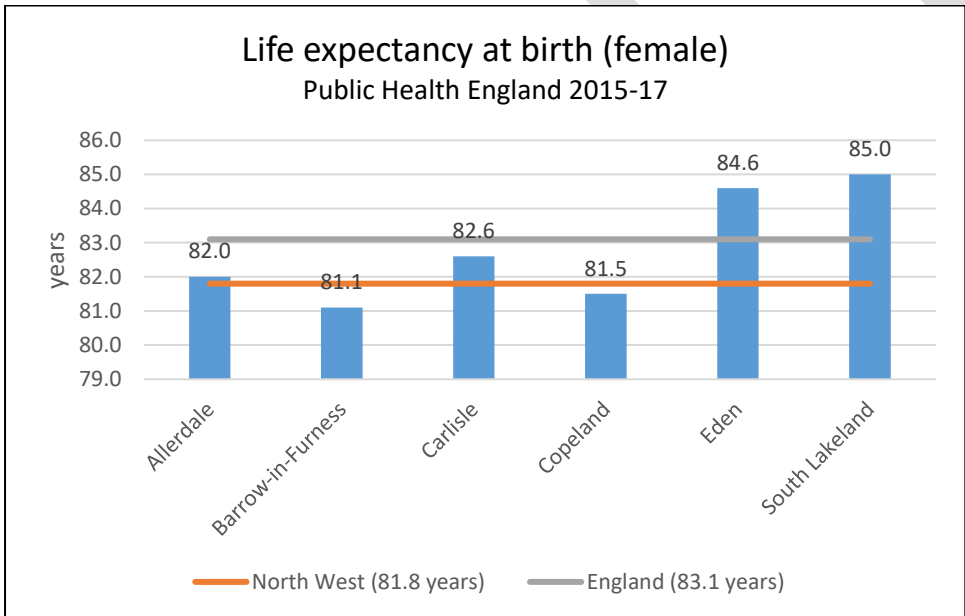

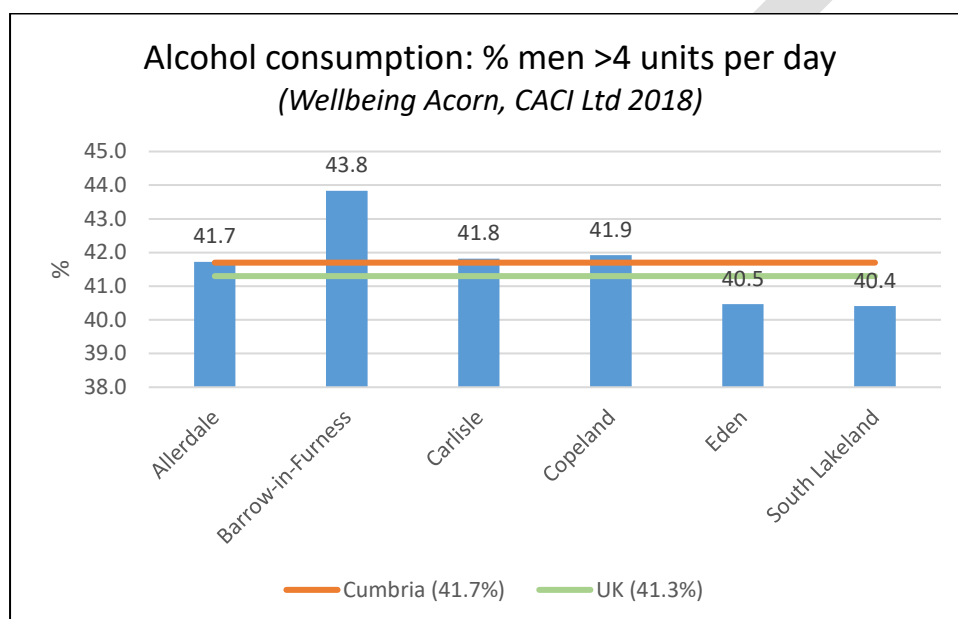

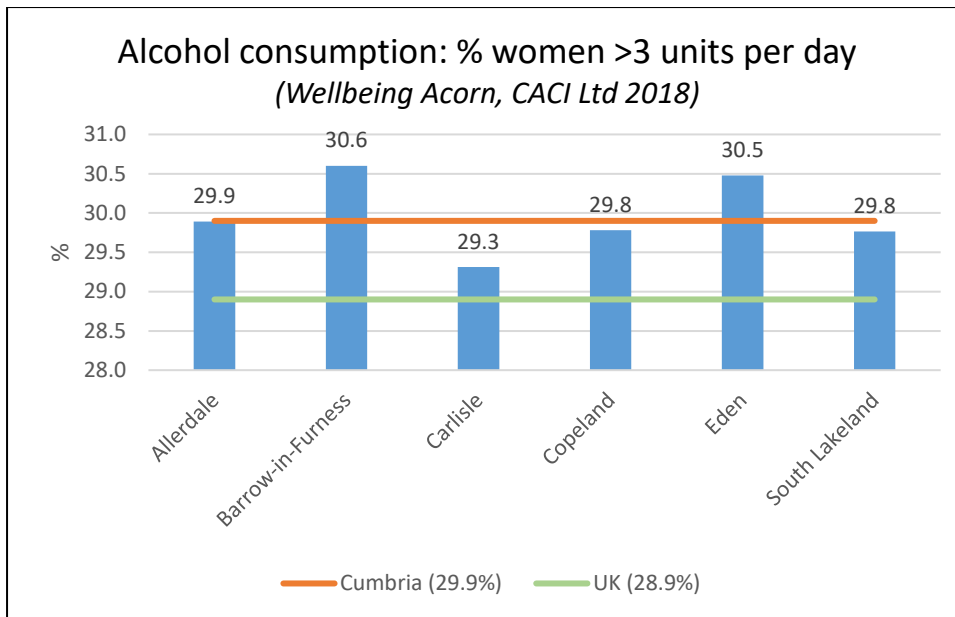

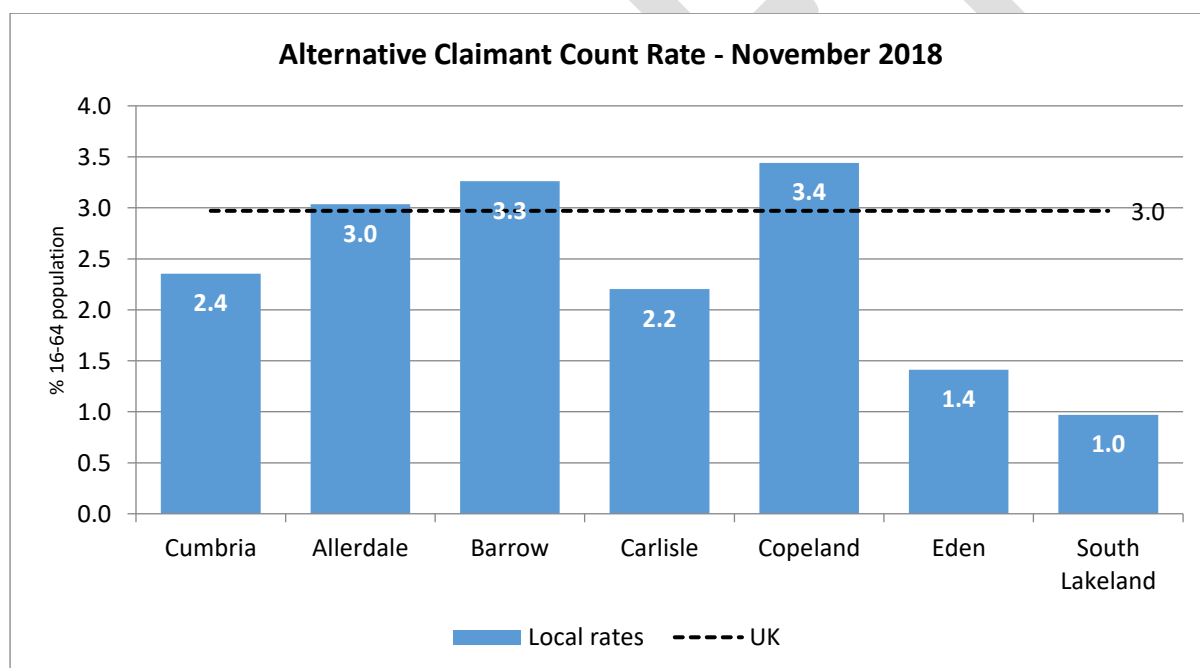
