

POST-16 TRANSPORT – LOW INCOME FAMILIES  
2020/2021 Academic Year



To qualify for 'low income' Post-16 transport assistance students MUST:

- Be under the age of 19 years on 1 September 2021 and;
- have applied for a full time course (a minimum of 17 hours per week) and;
- live over 3 miles from their catchment 6<sup>th</sup> form or
- live over 3 miles from their nearest college offering the vocational area they are studying.

Is your parent/carer in receipt of one of the following:

- Income Support;
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance;
- An income-related employment and Support Allowance;
- Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999;
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit) and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190 as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs;
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit;
- Universal Credit.
