Cumbrian SACRE Development Plan 2024-2029: Over the past year, a SACRE working group has carried out a selfevaluation and a new development plan for 2024-2029 is nearing completion. The new plan has five aims and will be available on the SACRE website pages. As well as an aim around evaluating the implementation and impact of the new Cumbrian Agreed Syllabus, another aim is for SACRE to promote improvement in the provision of Collective Worship. We will soon be contacting headteachers to complete an online survey to inform our planned programme of CPD and development activities for Collective Worship.

Cumbria RE Teachers Group: The next focus of this free online group will be on **assessment** starting at 4pm on 18th April. There will be an opportunity to share best practice and to consider new models for assessing substantive and disciplinary knowledge. There will be a meeting for RE teachers in very small primary schools on Tuesday 2nd May at 4pm. The focus of this session will be on long term planning of RE with three or more year groups. Sign up <u>here</u>.

Disciplinary Approach to RE: We concluded our series of CPD on Theology, Philosophy and Human Sciences organised last term. In Spring 2025, we will be running a repeat of these sessions covering all three disciplines in one day.
