## **Commons Act 2006 – Section 8**

## NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR THE APPORTIONMENT OF A RIGHT OF COMMON

Notice is hereby given that an application was made by **Graham John Lewis** and **Rachael Elizabeth Lewis** ("The Applicants") to Cumbria County Council, as Commons Registration Authority at the time of application, under Section 8 of the Commons Act 2006 and in accordance with the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2014. The application relates to entry number 278 of common land register unit CL20 Caldbeck Common. Cumberland Council has succeeded Cumbria County Council's functions in respect of the application and has a duty to process and determine it.

A summary of the effect of the application is as follows:

The right to graze 21 sheep or their equivalents (2 cows = 8 sheep = 1 horse) or any combination of these equivalents on Caldbeck Common comprising the whole of the land in this register unit is attached to O.S. field numbers 507 and 508 ("the Right"). Pursuant to the division of the land to which the Right is attached, the Applicants seek by their application to register apportionment of the Right appropriate to the parts of land transferred and now in their ownership.

If the application is granted, in whole or in part, the registration authority will give effect to the determination by making the following amendment to the commons register:

- 1. Entry number 278 will be deleted and reference made to the new corresponding entries.
- 2. Addition of supplemental maps.

3. The following entries will be made to the rights section of the commons register to show the proportionate apportionment of the Right to (a) The Applicants, and (b) the remainder of the Right:

- a. The right to graze 2.38 sheep or their equivalents (2 cows = 8 sheep = 1 horse) or any combination of these equivalents on Caldbeck Common comprising the whole of the land in this register unit is attached to O.S. field numbers pt507 and pt508, as shown coloured orange on the proposed supplemental map.
- b. The right to graze 18.62 sheep or their equivalents (2 cows = 8 sheep = 1 horse) or any combination of these equivalents on Caldbeck Common comprising the whole of the land in this register unit is attached to O.S. field numbers pt507 and pt508, as shown coloured blue on the proposed supplemental map.

Any person wishing to make representations:

- must quote the Application No. CA3/45
- must state the name and postal address of the person making them, and the nature of that person's interest (if any) in any land affected by the application and may include an e-mail address;
- must be signed by the person making them;
- must state the grounds on which they are made; and

Any representations made will not be treated as confidential, to determine the application it will be necessary for the commons registration authority to disclose information received to others, which will include the Applicants and may include other local authorities, Government Departments, public bodies, other organisations and members of the public (Data Protection Act 1998).



Working for Cumberland Council and Westmorland & Furness Council Representations may also be disclosed upon receipt of a request for information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 or the Freedom of information Act 2000.

The period for making representations expires at 5pm on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2024.
