

**The County of Cumbria (various roads, Carlisle Urban and Rural area)  
(Consolidation and minor amendment of Traffic Regulations) (Order 2001)  
Variation (No. 59) (Sewell Lane, Carlisle) Order 2021**

1. The Cumbria County Council hereby give notice that on 16 March 2021 it made the above Order under Sections 1, 2, 19, 32, 35, 35A, 38, 45, 46, 47, 49, 51, 53 and 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
  
2. The Order will come into operation on 22 March 2021 and its effect will be to : -
  - (a) Remove the existing “one-way traffic” restriction on the U1164 Sewell Lane (formerly known as Sewells Lonning), from a point 130m north of its junction with the A6 (Carleton Road) travelling in a south-westerly direction to a point 25m north of its junction with the A6 (Carleton Road), thereby reverting the whole length to two-way traffic; and
  
  - (b) Introduce a “Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles Exceeding 7.5 Tonnes Maximum Gross Vehicle Weight” restriction, on the entire length of Sewell Lane, Carlisle (with exemptions for emergency service vehicles and vehicles being used by the local authority in the pursuance of statutory functions, including refuse vehicles).

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within six weeks of 16 March 2021 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
