On Kentmere side route passes by fields then through open sheep & cattle pasture land.

On Longsleddale side, at Sadgill, route passes next to homes and farm buildings; take care, be aware of sensitivity. Damage to walls, gateways and buildings has been a reoccurring issue. Open pasture as Kentmere higher up. Farmers requirte to use the entire route for access to their land and stock.

General description of route, and observations

Gentle climb on rough stony track on Kentmere side. Last opportunity to turn around 200m beyond top gate.

Ascent from Sadgill/Longsleddale is rough and steep with bare rock and stony hairpins. Impractical for non specialised 4x4s and/or inexperienced drivers.

Angled gateway at Sadgill restricts vehicles to those less than 1.8m wide and/or 4.5m long.

There is no opportunity to turn around on ascent. It is recommended to inspect route first.
