



What this consultation is about

This consultation document is about proposals for changes to the following schools:

- Brook Street Primary School, Edward Street
- Petteril Bank Primary School, Harraby
- Inglewood Infant School, Harraby
- Inglewood Junior School, Harraby
- Pennine Way Primary School, Silverdale Road, Harraby
- St Cuthbert's Catholic Community School, Victoria Road
- Upperby Primary School, Uldale Road, Upperby

The proposals are part of a wider review of the number of primary school places in Carlisle as a whole. Further information can be found at **cumbria.gov.uk/ childrensservices/school-organisation**

In each of these schools the council is proposing to increase the number of pupil places available. In the case of Petteril Bank, Inglewood Infant and Inglewood Junior schools this can be done without additional building work.

At St Cuthbert's, Upperby, Brook Street and Pennine Way schools building work would be required to increase the classroom space available; at Brook Street School this would involve the refurbishment of the former music centre. We are proposing that Pennine Way School be rebuilt on the NCTC site as a bigger school. This would be part of a larger regeneration project for the Harraby area.

We are suggesting these measures because the current information available shows us that the school age population in the Carlisle South and Central areas is now increasing.

The county council wants to hear your views on these proposals before deciding whether to make the changes.

This document is aimed at parents, staff, governors and everyone else with an interest or stake in primary education in the area.

More information

How we know extra places are needed

By law the council must make sure there are enough school places in the area. On the basis of the current information available to us we think there is a risk that there may not be enough places in some schools in future.

Each year the county council looks at data provided by local GP surgeries. This data shows how many children have been born and where they live. From this information the council can estimate the number of children who are likely to require a school place in the future in each area. In the Carlisle area generally, and the Carlisle South and Central areas in particular, the data shows the number of school age children is increasing.

Each year, the county council checks its pupil forecasts against actual numbers on roll to determine how accurate we have been in the past. On this basis, we can modify the forecasts and improve them where necessary, but in the past our projections have proved to be very accurate. Forecasts for primary school intakes can only be made accurately for the next four years, because children who will require a place beyond that time are not yet born.

How many places we think are needed

The council is proposing that the following numbers of extra places will be provided:

FE = Form of entry (a form of entry constitutes 30 children)

If all of the changes above were to be implemented, this would increase the number of places available in Reception classes and subsequent year groups from the current 384 to 477. Whilst this is fewer than the number of children we might expect to be living in the catchment areas in September 2014, some parents traditionally choose to seek places at schools outside of the area. We expect, therefore, that a proportion of the 519 children forecast to require a Reception place in September 2014 will seek and be allocated one elsewhere. Only the size of the Reception class will be affected each year and therefore the overall school size will increase gradually as those children move through the Key Stages.

Next steps

The School Organisation and Governance Regulations mean that, if a council proposes to close a school, change an age range or increase the capacity above a certain point, their proposal must be published in a statutory notice.

For the proposed changes set out above, formal consultation and the publication of a statutory notice are required for:

Brook Street Primary School, Edward Street
Petteril Bank Primary School, Harraby
Pennine Way Primary School, Silverdale Road, Harraby
St Cuthbert's Catholic Community School, Victoria Road
Upperby Primary School, Uldale Road, Upperby

It is important that we understand your views on all of the changes proposed, whether or not they require statutory proposals.

There are five stages to the statutory process which must be followed:

Consultation

The issue of this document marks the beginning of a period of consultation during which the views of any interested parties are sought. These views will be considered before any move to the next stage of the process happens.

Publication

Dependent upon the outcome of this consultation, a decision on whether to proceed in issuing a statutory notice must be made by Cumbria County Council's Cabinet.

Representation

Following publication of statutory notices respresentations can be made on the proposals. This period lasts for four weeks.

Decision

Within two months after the representation period ends, the county council must make a decision on the proposal.

Implementation

If the proposal is approved then it is likely that changes would be implemented from September 2012.

Have your say

The council's proposals will be the basis of a period of public consultation for six weeks from 1st November to 16 December.

You are invited to a consultation event so that you can find out more about the options. The event will run as a drop-in from 3.45pm to 6.45pm where you can speak to council officers informally on a 1-2-1 basis. This will be followed at 7pm when there will be a presentation from council officers and an opportunity for questions.
